### **Introduction and participation**

The BEREC Board of Regulators (BoR) held its 29<sup>th</sup> ordinary plenary meeting on 8-9 December 2016 in Berlin, Germany.

The meeting was attended by the Heads and/or high-level representatives of the NRAs established in each EU Member State which have primary responsibility for overseeing the day-to-day operation of the markets for electronic communications networks and services. Heads and high-level representatives of the NRAs from the EFTA States and the States that are candidates for accession to the EU, the Commission and the EFTA Surveillance Authority also took part in the meeting.

	The BoR endorsed the outcome of the election.

# 3. Expert Working Group Co-Chairs 2017-2018

Introduction by	BEREC Chair (BNetzA)
Information presented	Article 11 (1) of the BoR Rules of Procedure of the Board of Regulators provides that the BoR "may decide to create EWGs to assist with the performance of the tasks and functions of BEREC and request the Office to provide support. The Co-Chair of each EWG shall be designated by the Board of Regulators".  As the EWG Co-Chairs were appointed until 31 December 2016, the BEREC Chair therefore tabled a new draft BoR decision which establishes the EWGs and its Co-Chairs for the period of 2017-2018.  The BEREC Chair informed the meeting about the RoP governing the nomination and selection procedure of the EWG Co-Chairs. He informed the meeting that there is only one nominated EWG Co-Chair for the End-User EWG and three for the new International Roaming/Mobile EWG, which, he highlighted, is a temporary situation due to the extended scope of the group.
Conclusions	The document was approved for publication.

# 4.1 Draft BEREC Opinion on the European Commission's proposals for a review of the electronic communications framework

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	sion's proposals for a review of the electronic communications framework
Introduction by	RF EWG Co-Chairs (AGCOM/NMHH)
Information presented	The European Commission has launched a review the EU regulatory framework for electronic communications for the first time since 2009. A draft Directive establishing a European Electronic Communications Code (EECC) was published on 14 September 2016.
	The EWG Co-Chairs presented the draft opinion on the European Commission's proposals for a review of the electronic communications framework.
	At the beginning the EWG Co-Chair presented the structure of the document. It starts with an introductory part serving as an "umbrella" giving a general opinion on the EECC. It highlights positive and negative aspects of the EC's proposal.
	The following elements of the draft Code have received BEREC positive feedback:
	<ul> <li>Code consolidating the existing Directives into a single one (the "Code");</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>No prioritisation of one regulatory objectives over another;</li> </ul>
	- Scope broadened in proportionate way;

	<ul> <li>Member State flexibility in defining the scope of the Universal Services and US still as a "safety net";</li> </ul>
	- Harmonisation of minimum set of competences for independent NRAs.
	In BEREC's view the following components of the draft Code have been considered as weaknesses:
	<ul> <li>Complex set of conditions for NRAs to meet in order to be able to apply ex-ante regulation</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Specific provisions restricting NRAs' ability to promote competition in the name of investment</li> </ul>
	- Spectrum management unduly stiffened (e.g., by mandatory "peer review")
	<ul> <li>End-user protection: concerns in relation to the "full harmonisation" concept</li> </ul>
	- Reduced flexibility as to US funding
	- BEREC's institutional set-up (Agency model).
	Next, the document focuses on the assessment of key subjects:
	<ul> <li>scope of the regulation, definition of the ECS and end user provisions;</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>access regulation (it focuses on three issues – competition and investments; unjustified constraints in the use of the regulatory measures; importance of regulatory certainty);</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>governance (main focus has been put on NRAs tasks; BEREC as an EU agency; regulatory harmonisation and single market).</li> </ul>
Conclusions	The document was approved for publication.

# 4.2 Oral up-date on the outcomes of the workshop on the Implementation of the Cost Reduction Directive

Introduction by	RF EWG Co-Chairs (AGCOM/NMHH)
Information presented	The Co-Chairs of the RF EWG informed the BoR on the outcomes of the Workshop on the Implementation of the Cost Reduction Directive (CRD).
	The workshop took place in Brussels on 13 October 2016. It was envisaged to exchange information and experience on the state of play of implementation of the Cost Reduction Directive and contribute to the development of best practices with a view to the enforcement of quality and of compliance with in-building physical infrastructure obligations. The objective was to highlight the lessons learned so far in the implementation process and the challenges member states are facing.
	The workshop was divided into sessions dedicated to different aspects of implementation of the CRD. It focused not only on implementation, but also on the ongoing national experience related to putting the rules into practice. In his introductory speech, the Commissioner described the rules and

	the problems encountered in implementation. Then national experiences
	from Germany, Italy, Spain and Portugal were presented, focusing on legal
	obligations. Furthermore, the information collection systems put in place in
	Germany and Finland were discussed.
	The workshop facilitated identification of good practices and roles that NRA can pursue when implementing the CRD.
Conclusions	The BoR took note of the information.

# 5. BEREC Work Programme 2017

Introduction by	Incoming BEREC Chair (ARCEP)
Information presented	According to Article 5 (4) of BEREC Regulation, the BEREC Board of Regulators shall, after consulting interested parties, adopt the annual Work Programme of BEREC before the end of each year preceding that to which the Work Programme relates. The Board of Regulators shall transmit the annual Work Programme to the European Parliament, the Council and the European Commission as soon as it is adopted.  The representative of the incoming BEREC Chair presented the process of preparation of the draft BEREC Work Programme 2017 (WP 2017) and its final results. The work on the draft BEREC WP 2017 had been initiated at the beginning of this year and it had been extensively discussed and consulted through the year with both NRAs and stakeholders.  In the last BoR meeting in Vilnius, it was agreed that the draft BEREC WP 2017 would be the subject of public consultation. The public consultation on the draft BEREC WP 2017 ran from 7 October to 2 November. During the public consultation BEREC received 9 contributions, which have been taken into account to the extent possible. The representative of the incoming BEREC Chair gave an overview of the contributions received and of how they were taken into account in the final draft BEREC WP 2017. Then she informed the BoR on the amendments made after the public consultation and CN meeting in Jurmala.
Conclusions	The BEREC WP 2017 was approved as submitted for publication and implementation and for submission to the European Parliament, the Council of the EU and the European Commission.

	The representative of the EC informed the BoR about the letter and the
	MoU on data sharing which were sent to the NRAs on 16 November 2016

inviting them to join the data collection exercise. The broadband mapping project requires NRAs to build national mapping tools that will help to get a better picture of broadband deployment across Europe. The EC representative informed the meeting about the workshop dedicated to this initiative for stakeholders and NRAs that will be held on 12/13 December 2016. He also reported that Broadband Competence Offices (BCOs) have been set up in member states with a view to fostering and improving EU funds absorption. Their main purpose is to facilitate the use of structural funds and provide support for local initiatives in the process of infrastructure development.

### Roaming

The representative of the EC informed the BoR of the recent developments on the Review of the wholesale roaming market. EP and Council agreed their positions on 29 November 2016 and on 2 December 2016 respectively. The first trilogue between the EU institutions will take place on 14 December 2016.

As for the Implementing Act on Roaming fair use and sustainability, the EC representative reported that a new text of the Act was circulated to CO-COM and is due to be voted at the next meeting on 12 December 2016. He highlighted increased interest by the general public and consumer organisations on the subject. The EC wants to meet the deadline of 15 December 2016.

### WiFi for EU

The COREPER agreed on a general approach on WiFi for EU on 2 December 2016. Rapporteurs in the EP have been nominated. It is expected that the trilogue will start as soon as possible so as to start the implementation of the programme in the beginning of 2017.

#### **European Electronic Communication Code**

On the European Electronic Communication Code, the EC representative reported that the draft directive has been well received by the EP and Council. In the EP, the Code has been assigned to the EPP (Mrs Pillar del Castillo) and the BEREC Regulation to the ECR (Mr Evžen Tošenovský). He informed the meeting that the negotiations in the Council have entered into its substantive phase of exchange of views between the Member States with the discussions on the IA of the proposals.
