

BEREC expert workshop on IP-Interconnection in co-operation with OECD

**20 June 2012, 9:00-18:00
Hotel Silken Berlaymont Brussels**

BEREC organized the first expert workshop on IP-interconnection in co-operation with the OECD in November 2011. Experts from the IP-interconnection community met with experts on interconnection from national regulatory authorities to discuss future interconnection in an all-IP world. The workshop served as a fruitful starting point for a BEREC work item on IP-interconnection.

BEREC will publish a consultation document "An assessment of IP-interconnection in the context of net neutrality" at the end of May. It is part of a larger work-stream on "Net Neutrality" also analysing other aspects of Net Neutrality such as transparency, quality of service and competition issues. The project aims at providing a better understanding of interconnection arrangements between IP networks (players across the value chain, types of interconnection, recent developments). Also the regulatory aspects of IP-interconnection are assessed with regard to preserving Net Neutrality in the context of IP interconnection. The consultation document includes a number of questions on which BEREC seeks input from stakeholders particularly from the Internet community. The workshop is intended to present the document and invite initial feedback. A final document taking into consideration the consultation input is due for publication by the end of the year.

Another focus of the workshop is the upcoming Review of the International Telecommunication Regulations (ITRs). The World Conference on International Telecommunications (WCIT), convened in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, will take place 3-14 December 2012. This International Telecommunication Union conference will consider a review of the ITRs. While the BEREC and ITU processes are completely independent they touch on common themes (e.g. charging principles for IP-interconnection). This session will explore the implications of domestic and regional approaches on IP-traffic exchange for the discussions that will occur at WCIT-12.

The format of the three sessions is intended to allow for an extensive discussion between participants and delegations are asked to send working level experts. Due to the desire to make the workshop interactive, the total numbers are limited and participation is by invitation.
