- It will include projects stemming from EECC or specific regulation, and carry-over projects, from WP 2021.
- But also prospective projects for 2022 and beyond of which some are proposed by stakeholders.
- A call for input will be launched in Q1 2021.

Public consultation

Stakeholder submission:

19 submissions were received

- Overall the submissions are very diverse and often express views contrary to each other
- Topics which received a high attention include "accessibility",
 "efficient access seeker", relation to SMP framework, "new" and
 "small" deployments
- Some topics are not within the scope of the Guidelines (e.g. nature of competition problems adressed)



BEREC Guidelines

Changes made to the Guidelines:

- NRA specifies assumptions on hypothetical efficient access seaker (GL 73; now 74)
- Data of individual operator is subject to NRA's assessment (74; now 75)
- Actual evidence from areas were network replication already took place can inform NRA's assessment (66 new)
- No changes to the definitions of "new" and "small"
- Futher minor clarifications/ amendmends (e.g. relation to SMP)

Draft BEREC Guidelines on Geographical surveys of network deployment. Verification

- BoR (20) 40 detailed the indicators that characterise the reach of broadband networks (Art 22 EECC).
- Ensuring the quality of data is an integral part of the processes leading to reliable broadband maps.

 The draft GL deal with the verification of the current broadband reach information.



Draft BEREC Guidelines on Geographical surveys of network deployment. Verification

 They describe verification methods and provide recommendations for Authorities, that may choose amongst those considering their needs and the information available.

 The verification process should be objective, transparent and nondiscriminatory.

 Authorities should publish their verification methodologies and a regular outline of the verification results.

PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON DRAFT BEREC GUIDELINES

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☐ From 16 June 2020 to 4 Sept 2020 (> 2,5 months)
□15 respondents (AIIP, BREKO, CETIN, DT, ECTA, ELFA, ETNO, FTTH Counci Europe, Open Fiber, OXERA, TIM, VATM, VKU, Vodafone, 1 confidential contribution)
□Summary feedback received:
☐ Smaller actors using wholesale inputs concerned on the implications of lifting SMP regulation as a result of a co-investment agreement as well as on the application of the criteria for qualifying for Article 76
□ ETNO and large players ask for more flexibility
□ BEREC has maintained the balance between being specific and flexibility
□In the next years, once the Guidelines will be applied and NRAs will gain relevan

□ In the next years, once the Guidelines will be applied and NRAs will gain relevant experience on application of Art. 76, appropriate to revisit Guidelines at the light of experience gained



BEREC Guidelines Art.76 EECC & report outcome PC

MAIN ISSUES RAISED AND BEREC RESPONSES

Stressing on BEREC rationales on co-investments publicly announced before December 2018: to be assessed by NRAs if substantial changes are made after December 2018 and networks were not deployed
No further specification on valid co-investment models (but more precise definition on joint-ventures).
further specifications on structural and governance issues considered over-restrictive by BEREC
Lifetime of the network: no specific timeframes can apply to all projects, should be individual and be set in the co-investment agreement
Relation between timing of entering into the co-investment agreement and the corresponding risk associated: valid for all models (previously just in one-way access model)
Significant changes during the commitment procedure: BEREC considers appropriate not to refer to an automatic restart of the six-month period. NRAs to assess reasonable additional notice period on a case-by-case basis not to slow down VHCN deployment



BEREC Guidelines Art.76 EECC & report outcome PC

OTHER ISSUES ADDRESSED IN THE GUIDELINES

☐ Clarifications in some of the guidelines to avoid misunderstandings or ambiguity
□ Clarification on the lifetime of the network not being shorter than period established for the binding co-investment commitments approved by the NRA
☐ Former guidelines 57-58 deleted due to different interpretations on the exhaustiveness of the list in Art. 76 (1) (b)
☐ If changes to the offer necessary, these must be notified in advance to NRAs and interested parties.
☐ Clarification on access for co-investors when upgrading FTTC networks and additional rationale on number of accessible lines limited by co-investment share.
☐ Significant changes in the commitment period: additional notice period to be assessed case-by-case by NRAs
☐ All changes and rationales for adoption/non adoption in the summary of responses

Responses from the public consultation


Mostly agreement on priorities with some arguments for earlier prioritisation.

 Stakeholders' appreciates BEREC's role in supporting the 5G deployment and fully agree with BEREC's view that 5G has a strategic priority to promote competition.

- One additional topic is added to the 5G Radar on satellite communication,
 making the 5G Radar illustration more comprehensive.
 - Satellite communications (space-to-earth and earth-to-space communications) are frequently associated with 5G connectivity use cases, and BEREC considers that there may be some benefit to adding it to the final radar.

The role of the 5G Radar and going forward

- The 5G Radar is developed to help BEREC and NRAs to plan addressing requirements according to their occurrence and urgency.
 - Essentially the 5G Radar should be seen as a complement to the yearly Work
 Programme, to help BEREC and NRAs to plan ahead, further than 1 year
 WPs.
 - BEREC would like to emphasize that the 5G Radar does not show projects,
 but developments that lead to issues that may require regulatory attention.
- BEREC emphasizes that it values the input from stakeholders on issues related to 5G and therefore will continue asking for involvement.
 - For 2021 one possibility is in the public workshop planned for Q1/Q2.

 - 2014 General Block Exemption Regulation (GBER)



EC targeted public consultation on state aid (II)

BEREC response

- BEREC adresses topics where NRAs have experiences in state aid rules and/or sector regulation
- Involvment of NRAs should be enhanced, because of experiences in/ relation to sector regulation and BCRD
- BEREC informs the Commission on relevant definitions (e.g. type of speed, VHCN)
- BEREC regards it as important that in principle a full set of access obligations is imposed and that conditions are consistent with other provisions

 Also organised series of webinars with stakeholders – during September 2020 to have a deeper understanding of vendors/associations perception on SM05 and SM06 (Huawei, Ericsson, Nokia, ECTA, ETNO, O-Ran alliance, GSMA).

- national competent authorities' perception of the 5G Toolbox SM05 and SM06
- the existing or planned national activities concerning the relevant legislation drafting for the implementation of the 5G Toolbox SM05 and SM06
- perception of the European Mobile Network Operators (MNOs) on SM05 and SM06
- the current situation about vendor- diversification of the technical equipment and software in the MNOs networks,
- the (present) MNO criteria for vendor 5G equipment selection.
- the open issues observed with this survey
- views of different vendors/associations which participated also in the webinars organised by BEREC WG during September 2020 – (Huawei, Ericsson, Nokia, ECTA, ETNO, O-Ran alliance, GSMA).
