# The Vilnius Agenda at a glance

- International roaming: further regulatory actions proposed
- Termination rates: common work together with the Commission
- Geographical markets: ERG supports more targeted regulation
- NGN regulatory principles: ERG launches public consultation regarding regulation of new IP world
- Spectrum management: ERG-RSPG joint working group
- Remedies and benchmarking: next steps on monitoring of compliance of application of ERG Common Positions by NRAs

#### INTERNATIONAL ROAMING

ERG provides results of data collection and policy advise on different segments of international roaming

- **>** Data collection
  - ➤ Monitoring (incl. Eurotariff) for period October 2007 to March 2008
  - > Preliminary data show clear evidence for further regulatory actions
- **➢ Policy recommendation** 
  - ➤ Voice: prices clustered just below the cap no evidence of competition
  - > SMS: prices several times the cost of provision extension of regulation
  - ➤ Billing unit: Hidden surcharges resulting from the common practice of billing per minute are also alarming
  - Data roaming: the case is finely balanced (early stage of development of this market)
  - > Billing shock: Transparency and customer empowerment required
- Documents expected in early July



#### **TERMINATION RATES**

ERG works together with the Commission on TR. A common view was adopted and communicated to the Commission:

#### ➤ Model:

- **▶ ERG** supports the application of cost-based modelling that is reflective of an efficient operator
- > But there should be sufficient flexibility in the model and
- > a best practice approach should be also considered
- **➢ Outcome (to make precise predictions is difficult):** 
  - > Past four years average MTRs have fallen by almost 40 per cent
  - > Differences in rates across Europe are also narrowing
  - > ERG committed to continue the decrease (reduction achieved in the past can be broadly replicated in the coming three years)



#### **GEOGRAPHICAL MARKETS**

The draft of the ERG Common Position on geographic aspects of market analysis was approved for public consultation:

- > The way of elaboration:
  - > Preliminary analysis with easily accessible data
  - > Decide whether there is need for further analysis
  - > Detailed analysis of competitive conditions
  - > Aggregating areas with similar competitive conditions
  - > Decide on remedies
- **▶** Possible implications of geographic differentiation:
  - > Deregulation in areas where competition is efficient
  - > Implementation of different remedies



### **NGN REGULATORY PRINCIPLES**

The Consultation document on Regulatory Principles of IP-Interconnection and NGN core was approved for public consultation:

- **≻**Content of the report:
  - ▶ background and facts necessary to analyse the regulatory implications of developments towards NGN core
  - **► NGN** network structure and topology
  - > regulatory implications and challenges resulting from the expected developments towards NGNs
- > Special questions to stakeholders are included in the document



## SPECTRUM MANAGEMENT

ERG-RSPG agreed to develop concrete roadmap for further cooperation. A joint working group was established:

- > Areas of common work including:
  - > Market definition
  - > Transitional issues
  - > Use of spectrum to dominate markets
- Decision on joint working is also proposed at next RSPG plenary (tomorrow)



#### REMEDIES AND BENCHMARKING

The next steps to live up to the ERG Statement on the Development of ERG (ERG (06) 51 – to put in place a monitoring system on the application of its Common Positions) were taken:

- **➤ Monitoring of compliance of application of ERG Common Positions:** 
  - > ERG timetable for Common Position monitoring exercises
  - > Summary of monitoring exercises in NRAs on broadband markets
- > Benchmarking activities:
  - ➤ Mobile Termination Rates Snapshot as of January 2008
- ➤The Final Report on the Best Practices on Regulatory Regimes in Wholesale Unbundled Access and Bitstream Access has been approved for publication



# SIGNIFICANT MARKET POWER

A report on Guidance on the application of the three criteria test was approved for publication:

- ➤ Handling of transitory period, as the Recommendation on relevant markets susceptible to ex-ante regulation changed
- >Application of three criteria in order to determine whether a market is a candidate for ex-ante regulation
- **→** Guidance on the application of the three criteria test
  - ➤ Indicators that may be of relevance for the purposes of applying the three criteria
  - > Assessment in 5 scenarios
