### The Rome Agenda at a glance

### **Harmonising VolP**

#### The Common Position on VOIP was approved:

- ➤ Key content of the CP: Numbering, Number Portability, Access to emergency services; PATS/ECS/PTN definition, Cross-border issues, Legal interception, 112 localization
- Consultation: Draft Common Position "ERG (07) 56 Rev1" submitted to consultation in October 2007, about 20 responses received
- Clarifications added to the final CP:
  - Modified definition of the term "Telephony Service"
  - Recommendations on numbering, number portability, access to emergency services
  - Access to 112
  - Network integrity obligations



### WBA/WLA

A draft Report on the Best Practices on Regulatory Regimes in Wholesale Unbundled Access and Bitstream Access has been approved for public consultation:

- Objective of the Report:
  - provide examples and illustrations on how NRAs can implement the Common Positions set out in ERG 06 (69) and ERG 06 (70) by identifying "Best Practices" as achievable models
  - using an evidence-based methodology to assess the impacts of broadband regulation
- 18 identified Best Practices:
  - > 10 on Quality of Service
  - 5 on Migration and Richness of Reference Offer
  - > 3 on Pricing



## Fixed and Mobile termination

Draft Common Positions on MTR and FTR have been approved for public consultation:

- Key content of the CPs: path towards symmetry
- Further content of the MTR CP: exceptions due to exogenous differences (access to spectrum) and transitory exceptions (late entry in the market), asymmetry before MTRs are at cost, to limit distortions created by MTRs above costs.
- Further content of the FTR CP: transition period is justified to allow OAOs to adapt to the new level of operational efficiency; NRAs should consider in next market 9 review setting a path to achieve symmetry in FTRs as soon as possible (e.g. over a period of 4 to 5 years) taking into account the prevailing local circumstances such as the date of market opening, the actual number of OAOs and their respective market shares.
- Accompanying document: economic introduction on MTR and FTR



## International Roaming Regulation

Next steps have been approved for the roaming data monitoring task:

- Key content of the ERG Report:
  - General approach maximum transparency
  - > State of compliance on transparency provisions
  - Detailed data collection for Q2 and Q3 2007
- > Timing:
  - Publication in January 2008
  - Subsequent ERG reports planned for June 2008 and December 2008



### **Work Programme 2008**

#### The Work Programme 2008 was approved:

- Outline of the WP:
  - Framework review,
  - > Further harmonization of the internal market,
  - Response to emerging challenges on the market
- Consultation: Draft WP08 submitted to consultation in October 2007, hearing on Nov 20, about 10 responses received (general support and acceptance of WP 2008, some comments on specific items)
- Next steps in January/February 2008:
  - First PT&WG Chairs meeting
  - Final PRDs, resource commitment of NRAs
