

BT proposals for ERG 2009 Work Programme

Background

BT agrees that the telecoms sector is in state of transition which will continue during 2009 but while some market situations are fast-changing there are many where access bottlenecks will persist, hence continued focus on rigorous market analysis and enforcement of remedies should be an essential part of the ERG remit.

A key area of focus should be the need to analyse the different market characteristics of business and residential customers, and the need for a separate analysis of wholesale local connectivity markets for business customers.

Framework Review

BT believes the ERG should concentrate on achieving effective and consistent implementation of remedies, particularly in relation to cross-border pan-European business services.

NGN/NGA

ERG needs a major focus on this area during 2009 including:

- Pro-competitive principles ensuring a fair return on investment;
- Balanced approach to remedies including availability of active remedies;
- Encouraging competitive access principles;
- Developing proposals to maximise regulatory certainty beyond individual market review periods without foreclosing competition;
- Guidelines on migration plans and industry consultation.

Dynamic and Differentiated Regulation

ERG should focus on the need for rigorous analysis and consistency in application of sub-national market definitions or remedies.

The presence of one competing network is not enough to justify deregulation. The UK Wholesale Broadband Access market review demonstrates the complexity of such analysis - even the higher number of 'principal operators' identified by Ofcom was not set as an arbitrary threshold but formed part of a more detailed analysis of direct and indirect constraints on incumbent behaviour.

As well as making sure geographic segmentation is not mis-used to deregulate where not justified by market circumstances, we also believe it is of critical importance to review the wholesale market for local connectivity markets for business customers.

Other issues

Convergence: ERG should continue to monitor Fixed/Mobile convergence as well as broader telecoms/media convergence.

Harmonisation: We believe the ERG should take a more active role in comparing national regulatory approaches and promoting best practice.
