## Why to intervene?

- No clear rules on net neutrality
- Traffic management non-transparent; blocking and throttling affects a significant number of subscribers (BEREC TMI 2012)
- Problems for:
  - Consumers, who can't enjoy full internet
  - CAPs with no guaranteed access to consumers
  - Operators facing different approaches



#### **Objectives**

- Guarantee of access to the full and open internet, without any blocking, throttling, degrading or discriminating services
- Support innovative, specialised, services
- Make sure that that these two can live together



#### How? (I)

#### **Net Neutrality**

- Open internet access
- Volume and speed-based contracts possible
- Harmonised rules for reasonable traffic management: ban on blocking and throttling of specific content, applications and services, except for a limited number of justified derogations
- Specialised services with enhanced quality (IP-TV, business services, eHealth): possible as long as they do not impair general quality of best effort internet
- => important role for national regulators



## **How? (11)**

#### **Transparency**

- Information requirements prior contract and at all times
- Focus on essential information
- Information on:
  - actually available speeds
  - data volume caps, if any
  - traffic management
  - comparison tools
  - data consumption control



## How? (111)

#### Facilitated switching

- Irrespective of contract duration termination possible after 6 months with 1-month notice
- Termination and switching rules apply to all elements of bundles comprising at least one electronic communications service
- Gaining provider to lead switching and number porting process
