Introduction and Participation

The 2nd meeting of the BEREC Contact Network (CN) for 2017 took place on **11 and 12 May 2017 in Reykjavik** (Iceland) kindly hosted by the <u>Post and Telecom Administration in Iceland</u> (PTA). The meeting was chaired by **Anne Lenfant** – Director of European and International Affairs (ARCEP) - the representative of the BEREC Chair 2017, **Sebastien Soriano** – President of ARCEP.

The meeting was attended by senior representatives of the NRAs with primary responsibility for overseeing the day-to-day operation of the markets for electronic communications networks and services. NRAs from the EU Member States, from the EEA countries and from the States that are candidates for accession to the EU were represented. Representatives of the EFTA Surveillance Authority (ESA) and the European Commission also attended the meeting.

Main Results of the 2nd meeting of the BEREC Contact Network in 2017

The objective of the meeting was to prepare the 31st ordinary plenary meetings of the BEREC Board of Regulators (BoR) and the BEREC Office Management Committee (MC) due to take place on 1 and 2 June 2017 in Cascais (Portugal). Consequently, the BEREC Contact Network (CN) considered all possible topics to be included in the BoR and MC agendas and concluded the following:

I. Documents to be submitted to the BoR

The CN agreed to submit the following documents to the BoR:

The BoR will be briefed on the recent activities of the BEREC Chair, important events in which he took part on behalf of BEREC, important projects carried out by the BEREC Office in support of BEREC as well as recent and forthcoming BEREC international activities. The BoR will be updated on the main activities of the Roaming, Benchmarking, Net Neutrality and MEA EWGs. The Commission was also invited to provide the BoR with information on recent important developments and activities related to international roaming; the telecommunication framework review; and the review of the SMP guidelines and other important initiatives.

The BEREC members will exchange views on the ongoing telecommunication regulatory framework review and decide on the way forward. They will also share national experiences on the implementation of the new roaming regulation. In addition, a representative of Analysys Mason will be invited to the meeting to present the results of the Net Neutrality Study.
