The Work Programme 2020 has been developed to prepare for the new challenges set out in the EECC and the new BEREC Regulation.



Primarily focused on the important, mandatory projects, which cover all five of BEREC's strategic priorities.



BEREC will continue to actively engage with stakeholders in public consultations and industry forums and by making information more accessible to the public and to its stakeholders.


