#### **Introduction and participation**

The BEREC Board of Regulators held its 58<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Plenary Meeting virtually on 7 March 2024.

The Meeting was attended by the Heads and/or high-level Representatives of the National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs) from each EU Member State that have primary responsibility for overseeing the day-to-day operations of the markets for electronic communications networks and services. The European Commission also took part in the Meeting. Heads and high-level Representatives of the NRAs with whom BEREC has concluded working arrangements were also present.

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# 5 Information from the European Commission

Introduction by	European Commission Representative
Information presented	The European Commission (EC) representative informed the BoR about the European Commission's main activities in the field of electronic communications and other relevant activities since the last plenary meetings.
	Main Commission's activities were described in the paper circulated to the BoR for information before the meeting:
	- Digital Decade Policy Programme (DDPP)
	The state of play of the Digital Decade was discussed with the Member States (MS) at the meeting of the Digital Decade Board on 1 February 2024, including early feedback on the strategic roadmaps received, the identification of best practices, and the European Digital Infrastructure Consortium projects (EDICs).
	Next Digital Decade Board meeting is planned in May 2024 while the publication of the next report is envisaged at the end of June 2024. It should be similar in structure as the last one with a focus on paving the way for the next programme.
	- Digital Markets Act (DMA) & Digital Services Act (DSA)
	The EC representative noted that gatekeepers that had been designated in September 2023 are required to comply with the DMA obligations by 7 March 2024. She thanked BEREC for its opinion on Meta's draft reference offer to facilitate WhatsApp interoperability under Article 7 of the Digital Markets Act. It was valuable input that was shared already with Meta. She reported that the final reference offer will be shared with BEREC for any additional comments.
	The BoR was also informed that the European Board for Digital Services met for the first time on 19 February 2024.
	The EC representative also drew attention to the Data Act and the need for designation of enforcement authorities by 12 September 2025. She expressed the view that from the EC's standpoint the NRAs would be best placed to take on this role.
	- Gigabit Recommendation
	On 6 February, the Commission adopted the Recommendation on the regulatory promotion of gigabit connectivity (Gigabit Recommendation). The Commission Gigabit Recommendation provides guidance to NRAs on the conditions of access to telecom networks of operators with significant market power to incentivise faster switch-off of legacy technologies and accelerated Gigabit networks deployment.
	- Gigabit Infrastructure Act (GIA)
	The Commission welcomes the political agreement reached between the European Parliament and the Council on the Gigabit Infrastructure Act (GIA) at the third trilogue on 5 February. It was highlighted that the agreed

	tacit approval accepted in the document will have better and faster impact on the market than the Broadband Cost Reduction Directive (BCRD).  The EC representative also welcomed the political agreement that addresses the rules on intra-EU communications that would continue the protection of end users. She also noted the need for BEREC involvement in this respect. BEREC will be asked for its opinion (probably to be delivered at P3) on the implementing act on FUP that needs to be developed by the end of 2024.
	She also noted and welcomed the fact that work has already been initiated on the two Guidelines that BEREC must prepare under the GIA.  - Review of the fair use policy and sustainability rules
	The European Commission will carry out a full review of the roaming rules due by 30 June 2025. BEREC would be expected to provide its input in Q1.

# 6 Preliminary exchange on digital connectivity package

Introduction by	European Commission Representative
Information presented	On 21 February 2024, the European Commission published a digital connectivity package that consists of:
	<ul> <li>The White Paper (WP) on 'How to master Europe's digital infrastructure needs?' analysing the challenges that Europe currently faces in the rollout of future connectivity networks and presenting possible scenarios to attract investments, foster innovation, increase security, and achieve a true Digital Single Market.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The Recommendation on the security and resilience of submarine cable infrastructures presenting a set of actions at the national and EU levels aimed at improving submarine cable security and resilience through better coordination across the EU, both in terms of governance and funding.</li> </ul>
	The Commission launched a public consultation (PC) on 12 scenarios set out in the White Paper. The consultation will close on 30 June 2024. The submissions will be published and will contribute to future policy actions.
	The European Commission representative presented this initiative to the BoR focusing on the factors identified as having influence on and transforming the telecommunications sector. She then presented the three pillars of the White Paper meant to address identified challenges.

	The EC representative also presented the Recommendation on the security and resilience of submarine cable infrastructures.  The BoR was asked to exchange initial views on the topic and agree on the way forward concerning the BEREC contribution to the public consultation.
Conclusion	The BoR agreed to contribute to the public consultation on the White Paper.

## 7 Digital Markets (DM)

Introduction by	DM WG Co-Chairs (Arcep/ANACOM)
Information presented	This draft report builds on the BEREC Report on the internet ecosystem and gives an overview of the impact of large application providers (CAPs) on the markets for ECN and ECS in Europe. It presents their strategies and business models, the market dynamics, and CAPs' relations with traditional ECN/ECS providers in terms of competition, cooperation, and interdependence.
	To better analyse the implications of the CAPs' presence and strategies in ECS/ECN markets, three case studies are carried out on CDNs, submarine cables, and internet relay services. Moreover, the draft report highlights some potential restrictions operating systems providers may impose on ECN/ECS operators.
	For this report, BEREC sent a questionnaire to the major CAPs between 17 July 2023 and 8 September 2023 and received responses from 9 CAPs.
	BEREC also organised three workshops with different stakeholders on: - international submarine connectivity in the European Union;
	- cloud services;
	- iCloud Private Relay.
	The co-chairs presented to the BoR the main takeaways of the report and areas of possible future work.
	They also outlined comments received after the CN meeting and explained how they were addressed in the final document.
	The draft document would be submitted to public consultation that would run until 24 April 2024.
	In addition, the co-chairs informed the BoR about the work on the BEREC high-level position on artificial intelligence and virtual worlds as its response to the public consultation launched by the EC on 9 January 2024. The co-chairs informed the BoR about the main points of this document and presented the next steps leading to its approval. The intention was to approve the document by 15 March 2024 via e-voting procedure and submit it to the EC.

## 8.1 BEREC Report on cloud services and edge computing

Introduction by	PFT WG Co-Chairs (PTS/CNMC)
Information presented	This report aims to gain further understanding of cloud computing developments in the digital sector and their impact on the electronic communication sector, including a reflection on their regulatory implications.
	The Report describes:
	- The general functioning of cloud services markets, interoperability, and switching remedies.
	- How cloud and electronic communications interplay from four different angles:
	connectivity required for the provision of cloud and edge computing;
	<ol> <li>migration of ECN to the cloud considers different elements and functions of the network (core, RAN edge, backhaul, and transport, as well as network operation and orchestration);</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>provision of new and enhanced ECN/S using cloud-based network services (i.e., Network-as-a-Service);</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>supplying bundled and integrated ECN/S and IT services with the cloud.</li> </ol>
	Against this backdrop, BEREC is gathering regulatory considerations around network cloudification and future trends that are expected to be relevant in the upcoming years.
Conclusion	The BoR took note of the information and approved the document for public consultation.
